ITEM 8: Review, correct, and approve the minutes from the November 11, 2014 Board Meeting; the November 20, 2014 Special Board Meeting; the November 24, 2014 Joint Planning/Board Meeting; and the December 2, 2014 Joint Executive/Board Meeting.

ITEM 9: Committee Reports; Outreach--Beautification-CPAB-VANC- Plancheck-LANCC-Homeless-Planning-Marijuana Clinic-Budget Advocates

Election of Candidates for Open Board Positions (Items 10 and 11)

ITEM 10: There is ONE open seat in the Business Category due to the resignation of Mr. Salvador Najarro. There is one applicant- Ms. Cindy Sower. The candidate(s) will be called before the board in alphabetical order by last name. The candidate(s) will read their candidate statement as submitted on their application. Afterward, the Board will be allowed a brief period to ask questions of the candidate(s). Then the Board will vote on each candidate, one at a time. Each Board member will have one vote: YES or NO. The candidate with the highest number of votes will be declared the winner of the open seat. After voting is completed, the winner(s) will read the SVANC Code of Civility and be seated on the Board with the potential ability to vote (a Board member's ability to vote is governed by the SVANC Bylaws, SVANC Standing Rules, and whether the board member is current with Ethics and/or Funding training).

ITEM 11: There are TWO open seats in the Youth Representative Category. There are three applicants, listed alphabetically, by last name: *Javier Fernandez; Xavier Isaac Gutierrez; Scally Yulisa Mazariegos*. We will vote for one seat at a time. The three candidates will be called before the board in alphabetical order by last name. Each candidate will read their candidate statement as submitted on their application. Afterward, the Board will be allowed a **brief** period to ask questions of the candidates. Then the Board will vote on each candidate, one at a time, with the knowledge that there are three candidates and only two seats to be filled. Each Board member will have one vote: YES or NO. The candidate with the highest number of votes will be declared the winner of the first open seat, then the vote for the second seat will proceed. In case of a tie, the candidate receiving the least number of votes will be eliminated and the board will vote again. After voting is completed, the two winners will read the SVANC Code of Civility and be seated on the Board with the potential ability to vote (a Board member's ability to vote is governed by the SVANC Bylaws, SVANC Standing Rules, and whether the board member is current with Ethics and/or Funding training).

ITEM 12: Motion/Discussion/Vote to send a letter to the City Council which states that we do not wish to have Street Vendors licensed to sell their wares in the Sun Valley Boundaries of the Sun Valley Area Neighborhood Council. We have had two discussions at two different meetings with the Pro and Cons of legalizing Street Vendors presented. It is now time for us to vote.

ITEM 16: Motion/Discussion/Vote to approve a Beautification Committee project clean up on Sunland Blvd and the Southbound exit for the 5 Freeway (diagonally across from Bob's Big Boy) for the 2nd Saturday morning in January. We will draw up and present for review a budget for the cleanup, not to exceed \$100 of Beautification funds.

ITEM 17: Motion/Discussion/Vote to reimburse Mark B. Allen Not to exceed \$270.00 for printed materials used to pass out to stakeholders for Small Business Saturday outreach

ITEM 18: Motion /Discussion/Vote to approve payment not to exceed \$38.00 to pay for LARGE STAPLER to staple AMEX Booklets and future needs--- paid CASH for by Mike O'Gara for our Amex Small Business Saturday.

ITEM 19: Treasurer's Report; Motion/Discussion/Vote to approve the Treasurer's Report.

ITEM 20: Motion/Discussion/Vote to reimburse Mike O'Gara for purchase of five headsets and one microphone headset purchased on Dec 4th to make the Interpreter headset system work, not to Exceed \$184.22

ITEM 23: Motion for Reconsideration of Item 4 of the November 24, 2014 Joint Planning and Board Meeting, which was an application from the planning Dept ZA-2014-3327 CUW, Env-2114-2014-3328 to place a monopole at 9870 Glenoaks Blvd. Vote was unanimous to approve a letter to allow a MONOPINE instead.

ITEM 24: Motion/Discussion/Vote to approve the Planning Committee to write comment letters to request that no Cell antenna be allowed to be built at the location, 9870 Glenoaks Blvd, as it will ruin the aesthetics of the hills back in the north, If any cell antenna will be built there it will be extremely ugly, ruining the look of the skyline. The location presently has an auto dismantling business on it but there is a "For Lease" sign on it. We do not know what business will be on this lot in the future. An argument can be made to have Verizon Co-locate this antenna at the site at 8365 Lehigh Ave where we have asked for an obelisk.
